usual. On to the next one. Even when my agent told me of the callback I was still convinced it could never happen. So, I went into the callback just as relaxed and playful as before.



Opportunities Abound In Voice Over

Whether you're a working voice talent or just starting out, do you know what kinds of opportunities are really out there? Through many years as a voice talent, casting agent and workshop host, I've discovered that one of the subtle differences between voice acting and camera work is that we tend to be very generous about sharing our leads in the voice biz. It's common to find voice actors sharing information with each other on auditions, skill development, networking and more. Sure, as actors we're all of the same cloth, but there seems to be a difference with voice talents. I've come to the conclusion that this is because there is so much opportunity available in voiceover that it's easier for us to share generously with each other.

In film and television there simply are fewer opportunities to go around. A number of factors contribute to this. For one, in camera work one's look often takes precedence over other factors - sometimes even acting ability. And though both camera and voice work demand knowledge, commitment, and perserverence to succeed, in voice it is possible to audition as many as 20 times per day. With camera work we're lucky if we can squeeze two auditions into the same day. Two a week or even two a month is a more common scenario. Simply finding and getting to those two auditions can be a job by itself! Obviously voice work gives us the better odds. It takes a while to break in, but with the right tools anyone can make it in this industry - even without the right "look."

Whether you find your auditions locally, via web based agents such as www.VoxTalent.com, or through agencies such as those on VoiceBank.net, the variety of available work is astronomical. Anything with a voice is an opportunity. Animation, Narration, Commercials, Station Imaging, Games, Talking Toys, Message On Hold, IVR and much more. The rates of course are all over the place.

Many instructors don't like to recommend the low-budget sites, feeling that they devalue the industry by offering low rates. Use your own discretion - just know there's a ton of potential work out there if you want to go after it. OnAir.ca or AdTel.com offer as little as \$10 to \$25 per page. Low budget commercial houses like SharkBytes-Studios.com pay \$10 and up, per spot. Eventually you'll want to get onto sites like Voices.com, Voice123.com, and OpuzzVoice.com, which rely on your subscription fees, and they can give you access to as many as 20 projects a day, many at rates of \$150 and up. Every day there are a variety of jobs on these sites, most non-union, offering you a lucrative way to make it in voiceover. In fact, just recently I was shortlisted for a FULL TIME

voiceover job via www.Voices.com, at a rate of \$10,000+ per month. Can you imagine? How many of us wouldn't gladly work full time for that kind of pay!

After the voiceover websites, your next goal should be to land a great agent to submit you for the higher end jobs that carry top rates perhaps even royalties. There are different types of voice agents these days. Most will be either union or non-union, and either live agencies or exclusively online.

If you're a union actor, you'll want to specifically look for union agents. If you're non-union, there are non-union agencies that you can pitch to, both in person and online. One is VoxTalent.com, an excellent resource for steady work at good rates. Another is CommercialVoices.com, offering great quality work, and its founder Rick Gordon is a great guy. And don't stop at just having a local agent in your home city. Sites like VoiceBank.net are a great way to broaden your base into the US - but you need to be represented by one of their member agencies to be on that site.
