Along my journey as an actor I've been privileged to study with some truly extraordinary talents, such as our own Deb Munro. I've attended sone incredibly excellent workshops, including Deb's Mic N Me series, that helped to propel my abilities to new levels. So I thought I knew what to expect when I attended *The Performer's Mastery* in Vancouver last month. I was wrong.



## Tip of the Month by Deb Munro

### Protecting Your Money Maker!




A voice talent's worst nightmare is losing their voice. Without a voice, we can't work. And if you're solely dependent on earning an income from voice over work, this could put you in a very scary position. Sure, you could insure your voice, but is that really a practical solution? An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure, they say. What's most important is that we consistently protect our vocal chords to prevent injuries that could sideline us from working.

As a backup, having a good health insurance protection is essential, even if a poor second choice to prevention. But good health insurance won't keep revenue coming in. Recently a rash of severe colds and flu has been racing across the continent. It seems everyone we encounter is either just getting it or just getting over it. So I want to stress the importance of protecting yourself from viral infections by whatever means you can. They can literally shut down your business.

If you so succumb, many voice talents prefer to to stay away from ALL medications and cough drops/syrups as they can damage your throat and can cause clicks in your voice, noises the mic catches that can make your voice less desirable. Some products out there are made specially for voicers and singers, such as *Thayer's Throat Spray* and *Entertainers Secret*. One of the newest tricks is a tablespoon of olive oil. Tastes awful, but works wonders for damaged throats.

And it's not just our throats that need care. We need healthy bodies to support our voices. At my first animation job I had a one year contract and everything went very well until about 6 months into the contract ... I seemed to get a cold a few days before my monthly voice session. The cold was usually very nasal and when I had to say my signature phrase, "Simply Sensational," I had what's called a Schnagle, a phlem sound in the throat that makes the recording less desirable. I don't know iwhether phsycological may have also contributed, but I was sick EVERY session after that for six months. That's when I first realized how important it was to keep my body healthy so my voice was always in top form. Another time the voice of a top TV station was sick and they asked me to fill in. I was sick then too, and had taken *Nyquil* to help me get my ZZZ's the night before. When I got to the studio,



I began recording, when the engineer suddenly stopped the session and asked me if I was on any medications. He said I was *clicky*. I learned that medications actually *cause* clicks. Now if you have to take them, you have to take them, but the bottom line is: *DON"T GET SICK. YOU CAN BE REPLACED!* 

Early last month I experienced a cold that took my voice away for over a week. It got into my head and stuffed me up so badly that on my flight home, my ear popped and caused me to temporarily lose my hearing in my right side. I couldn't even hear my own voice. That was an unbelievable feeling, and something I had never before considered. I had an audition for an animation series that same day, and somehow, with much luck, I got my hearing back just before the audition began. I later discovered that I had a sinus infection and ... yep ... had to take medication to cure the problem.

But it's been well over four years since the last time I was sick. Il've been fortunate, indeed, I truly believe that the reason I haven't been sick in so long is because I work out to keep myself strong and healthy. But in the past two months, between two moves, running three businesses, and still being a full time mom, I stopped excercising for a while - and the flu caught me off gaurd.

So remember, don't just exercise your voice - take care of your body too, to keep your energy high and your immune system in top form. The bottom line, always protect yourself and your health. Prepare for the unexpected so that you're ready if something happens. Know that when your body gets sick, it's your body's way of telling you to rest, so follow the doctor's orders and take care of *you*. After all, without you, there is no voice!
